The concept of CHRODIS

The Joint Action on Chronic Diseases and Healthy Ageing across the Life Cycle is the European joint action on cardiovascular diseases, Diabetes and Stroke launched on January 2014 for duration of 39 months.

The main objective of JA-CHRODIS is to promote and facilitate a process of exchange and transfer of good practices between European countries and regions, addressing chronic conditions, with a specific focus on health promotion and prevention of chronic conditions, multi-morbidity and diabetes.

Health promotion and prevention focus on behavioural risk factor, social determinants and inequalities in health. Work on multi-morbidity focus on multi-disciplinary & integrated care, patient safety and professional training. Diabetes as a case study focus on multidisciplinary care covering the whole range from primary prevention to treatment and addressing national plans. A Platform for Knowledge Exchange (PKE) is starting to gather and a web-based clearinghouse will offer decision-makers, caregivers, patients, and researchers the most relevant information on the best practices in chronic diseases focusing mainly cardiovascular diseases, stroke and diabetes.

Based on the objective, the exchange and transfer of good practices will result in improved outcomes of policies, programmes and clinical or public health interventions on chronic conditions. Grant Agreement Number 2013 22 01. Annex I a (Technical annex).






WP7: Diabetes

WP 7 will address diabetes with specific criteria to screen good practices in health promotion and disease prevention. It also has to contribute to identify potential good practices with a similar methodology as WP 5 and 6. In this case a revision of national plans is an added area of interest, and included as specific practices along with other sort of practices such as programmes or interventions. WP7, together with WP2, has to contribute also to promote the use of the PKE among stakeholders identifying potential good practices across Europe in these areas.







Sustainability of JA-CHRODIS

Through the Governing Board, Member States are to be involved in developing a plan of sustainability. This will help keeping chronic diseases at the forefront of the political agenda for health after the Joint Action ends. Gathering good practices in Platform for Knowledge Exchange (PKE) will doubtless contribute to the plan of sustainability of the process of exchange and transfer of good practices.



General Objective

mapping research on NCDs in Europe, adopting a unified approach and delivering open platforms that will help achieving targets agreed by governments and international institutions up to 2020

Specific objectives

- definition of a common methodology for the classification of research in NCDs
- data collection through systematic search and field survey
- unified presentation of research mapping exercises in each NCD
- unified taxonomy of research across NCDs, subdivided into broad areas of relevance to the EU Research Frameworks (FP7/Horizon 2020)
- standardized data definitions and principles of ethics, privacy and data protection in NCDs
- critical appraisal of the results, identifying strengths, weaknesses, overlaps and gaps in multidisciplinary NCDs research
- web-based repository of common definitions in research on NCDs (European Clearing House of Research on NCDs).

2.3. EUCHRON Consortium as a whole

- In diabetes, the fruitful collaboration between IDF, SERECTRIX, WIV-ISP and constituent staff of HIRS will continue the successful experience of EU-funded public health projects BIRO and EUBIROD over the last decade.
- In 2012, EUBIROD completed an automated EU report on a population of 200,000 subjects from nineteen countries in only two weeks from software release.
- The results of EUBIROD were achieved through the committed involvement of a global advocate of people with diabetes, the IDF, an SME with strong methodological and legal background, the active participation of centres with research experience and national responsibilities on diabetes data collection, e.g. the WIV-ISP, and dedicated staff with leadership and managerial ability, today affiliated with HIRS.
- Achievements of the collaboration also include: the organization of twenty-two international meetings in ten different countries, including participants from the USA, Cuba, Tanzania, China, Barbados, Kuwait; presentations at the IDF Diabetes World Congress in Montreal, Canada, the Academy Health, Boston, USA and the Diabetes Leadership Forum organized by the OECD in Copenhagen, Denmark;
- ranking among the six best public health projects of the year at the European Health Forum Gastein 2009 and 2012; inclusion of EUBIROD among the 20 success stories of the EU public health program; recommendation of the FP7 EUROREACH to use the BIRO approach as a means to provide access to research data across different diseases.
- The positive experience of EUBIROD may be usefully replicated in EUCHRON, building upon the knowledge produced by the project and the deep understanding of the coordination of European projects.

WP 2 title: NCD Research METHODOLOGY FORUM

Objectives:

- To establish a Research Methodology Forum including field experts from all target areas of NCDs
- To define a precise methodology for the sound construction of an evidence-based clearing house of NCDs

Description of work:

The WP will allow assembling and maintaining a Research Methodology Forum (RMF) that will remain active throughout the entire duration of the project. The Forum will include relevant high level consultants from the following areas: Scientific Leaders (Advisory Board), representatives of Scientific and Consumer Associations, European networks of excellence and associated project groups (e.g. EUROCOURSE, **EUBIROD**, Euro Heart Survey/EURObservational of the European Society of Cardiology, Excellence Centres Network of the European Society of Hypertension). WP2 will agree on the methodology for the systematic reviews of published and grey literature, the composition of survey instruments and the data structure of the clearing house implemented in WP6. The Forum will ensure the finalization of a detailed implementation plan, the regular review of all deliverables and the critical assessment of overlaps and gaps in NCD research at the end of the project.

Activities:

Activity 1: Creation and maintenance of the Forum (Task Leader: IDF) This activity relates to the proper functioning of the Forum throughout the project

Activity 2: Manual of Technical Specifications (Task Leader: SERECTRIX) The project requires a precise protocol that must include all specifications required to carry out the technical steps foreseen in the project.

The EUCHRON Proposal was submitted on February 6 2013 and was rejected on April 23 2013
