Purpose / Description:

European enlargement requires the development of common research protocols for Member States to support consistent comparative analysis of different health systems. The large variation of practices within and across regional areas undermines access to standardized levels of care for the European Community. Among the potential influential factors, a pivotal role is played by the improvement of organizational factors, for which information systems can be strategically used to enhance overall performance.

The BIRO project, whose primary objective is improving the collection of diabetes indicators for the European Commission, includes a special activity for technology transfer through which the Consortium intends to create the opportunity to engage regions in the systematic use of diabetes registers. A prerequisite of the collaboration is that knowledge on medical informatics, database and statistical systems is genuinely shared and widely disseminated across interested parties, so that registers can build on a common ground.

- introducing the background, rationale and technological aspects of BIRO
- exploring the current state of art in diabetes information in Romania, Malta and Cyprus
- discussing issues in the development of regional registers and the potential use of BIRO
- defining the workplan for the Technology Transfer Workpackage
